The Government are currently proposing millions in cuts to disability benefits. This will prematurely end the lives of many Disabled people, and push more of us into poverty.

An NHS in crisis, the crumbling of social care provision, and hospices reliant on charity funding all contribute to a painful death. Real dignity in dying means funding public services.



This bill will fundamentally change the function of the NHS and transform our relationship with healthcare professionals. Rushed and inadequate legislation risks lives.

A Private Members Bill is not the appropriate process for a law of this magnitude. There cannot be sufficient scrutiny.

We believe the inaccessible and nonconsultative passage of the bill has violated the UNCRDP.



This bill is not fit for purpose. Insufficient safeguards were weakened further at the committee stage, and vital amendments that could have offered us additional protections were voted down. As the bill currently stands - a panel of professionals wouldn't even need to meet the applicant for an assisted death. This bill does not effectively protect us against coercion.


